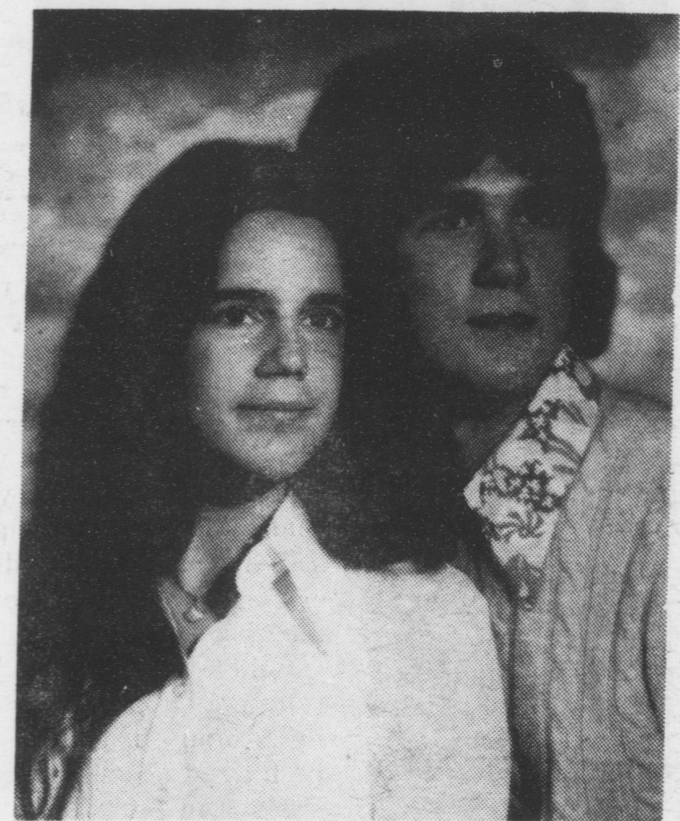
The bride is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Alvin Risser, Jr., Mount Joy RD2. She attended Donegal High School.
