Some of their tips are:
1. Check for freshness.

The needles should not be shedding or break when bent.

2. Keep the tree outside until you are ready to use

it, and keep its base in water. Recut it, on a diagonal, an inch above the original cut. FOR RENT

3. Keep the water level over the cut.

4. Don't set up your tree near any heat source; avoid a fire.
