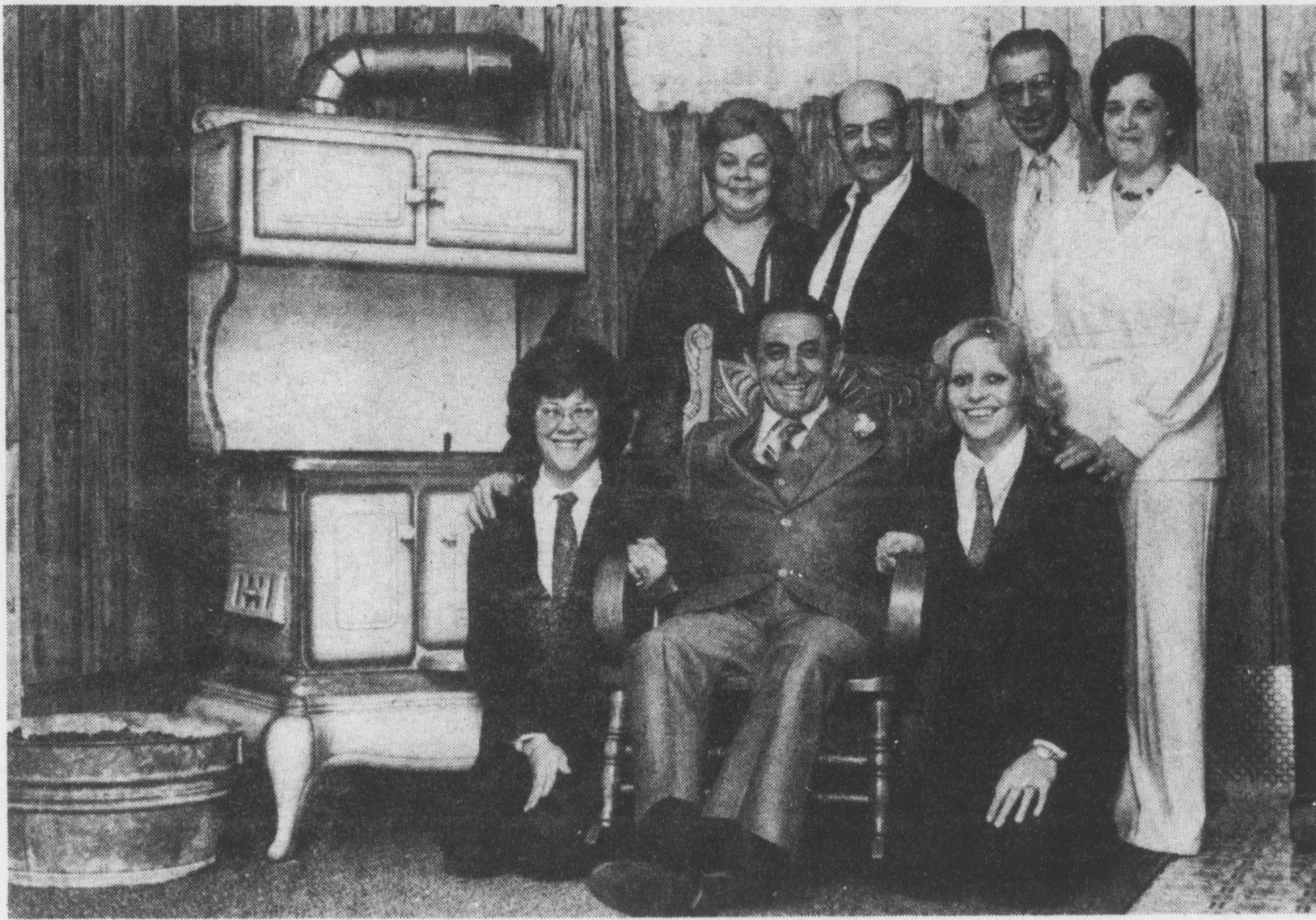


DID YOU HEAR...

XMAS TREE TIPS

The Lancaster County Consumer Protection Commission has a booklet on buying Christmas trees. If you want a copy, free, call 299-7921.

Some of their tips are:

1. Check for freshness. The needles should not be shedding or break when bent.
2. Keep the tree outside until you are ready to use

it, and keep its base in water. Recut it, on a diagonal, an inch above the original cut.

3. Keep the water level over the cut.
4. Don't set up your tree near any heat source; avoid a fire.
5. When the needles start falling off, the tree is dry and more of a fire hazard.
