

Jack Matoney addresses Governor's Council on trade schools

John Matoney of Mount Joy recently addressed the Governor's Council on Vocational Education in Harrisburg.

Mr. Matoney's remarks presented his personal views on vocational educa-

tion. He is a graduate of Patton School in Elizabethtown and was employed in the construction industry as a brickmason for more than 20 years.

Matoney, presently director of the Pennsylvania

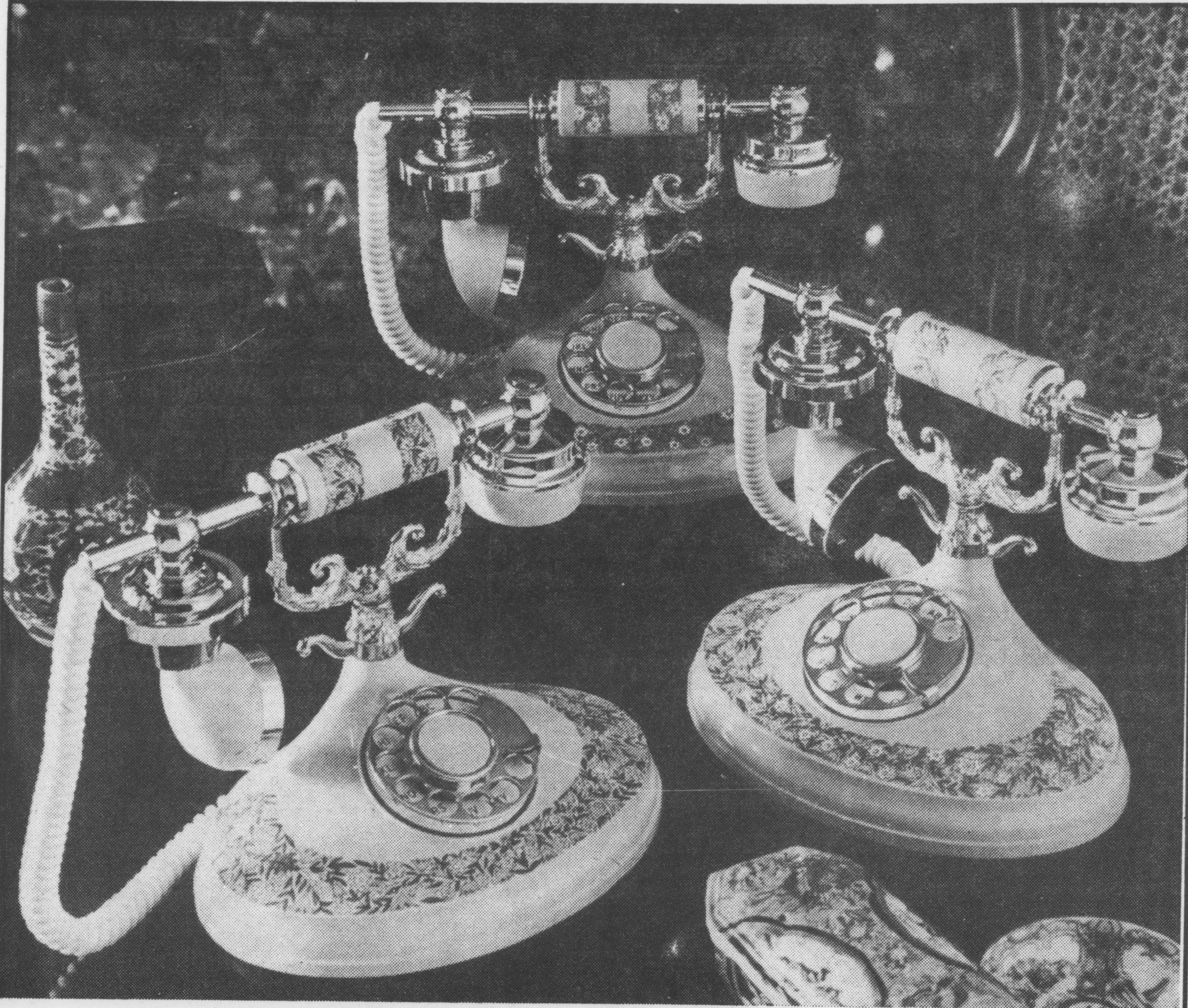
Apprenticeship and Training Council, also presented his personal belief that there is a growing need for and acceptance of public vocational training to provide the skilled craftsmen that our society requires.

He proposed that a study group of experts from industry, labor, and government design a program to increase awareness of the need for advanced education in craft training. Such a program would

insure that Pennsylvania would have a reservoir of skilled workers, in order to serve present industry and to attract new industry to the state.

Matoney said, "I believe

that the vocational education system is excellent. But with the input from this council, the Governor, and other related agencies, the system could grow stronger and better each year."
