for fish kill on the Lower Susquehanna River recently. As a result, the Company will pay the Pennsylvania Fish Commission \$1,500 and probably a like sum to the Pennsylvania Clean Streams Fund.

Lynn I. Ratzell of PP&L's Environmental Engineering organization attributed the fish kill to "thermal shock." Brunner Island Steam Electric Station's Unit 3 was shut down for ers, were killed when cold water mixed suddenly with the warm discharge channel water near the plant.

Ratzell pointed out, "We are examining what happened this time so we can develop procedures which will reduce the chance of any such fish kills in the future. Our findings and plans will be reported to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Resources."
