Elizabeth was 27 when she had Shelby. When Elizabeth was 30, Shelby was 3. When Elizabeth was 41. Shelby was 14. This happens every 11 years; 52 and 25 was the last time. 63 and 36 will be the next.

For this pattern to emerge, a mother must give birth when her age is a multiple of 9: 18, 27, 36, 45, or 54. The chance of this is (about) 1/9.

The chance of Elizabeth and Shelby's situation with birthdays happening is, roughly, .0003-three times in ten thousand.

This figure is gotten by multiplying 1/9 by 1/365.


