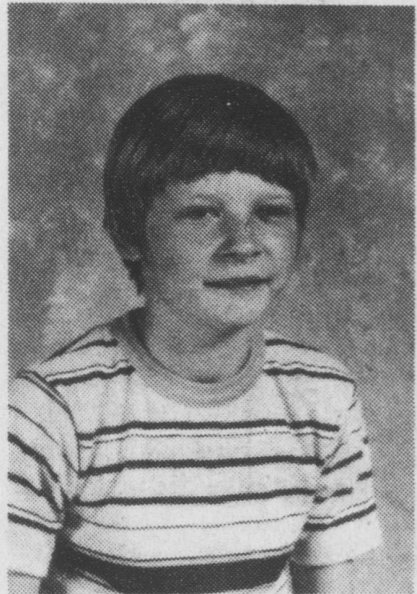

Patrick, a carpenter, works in Harrisburg.

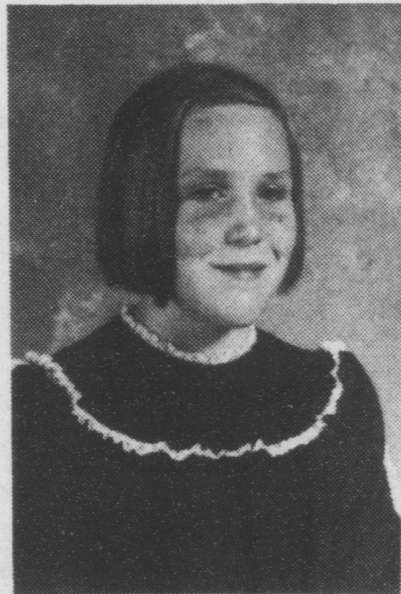
