Sweetheart King & Queen campaigns under way

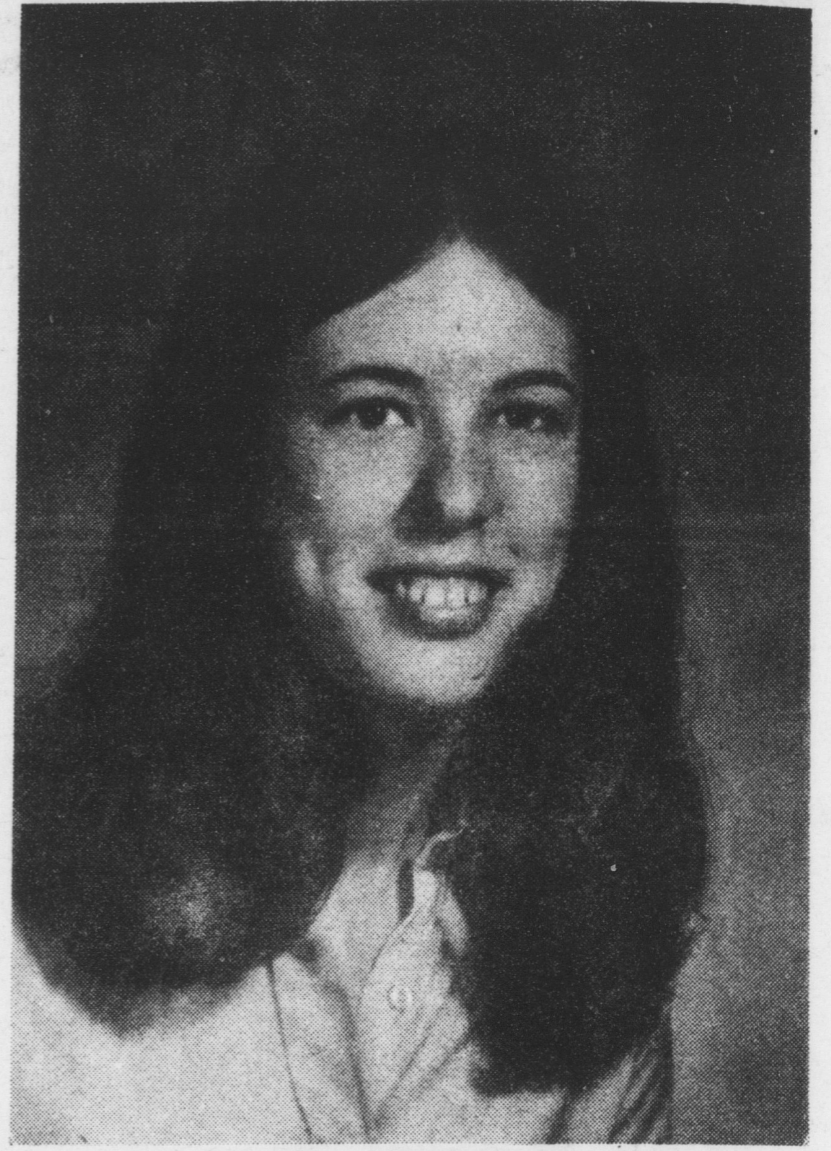
