She is survived by a number of nieces and nephews.

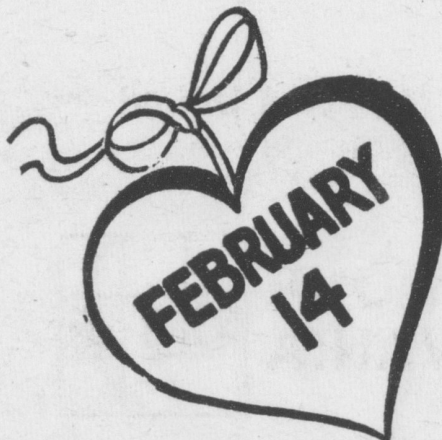
