Here are some interesting laws still on the statute books of our various states. In Evansville, Indiana is against the law to sell hamburgers on Sunday.

Here is a cute one. In Kansas an old state law states that one must not eat snakes on Sunday or rattlesnake meat in public. How about this one. A citizen may not carry a lunch pail on the public streets in Riverside, California.

Now get this. In Richmond, Virginia it is illegal to match coins in public to see who pays the bill. In Houston, Texas the law stipulates that you cannot buy rye bread, goose liver or limburger cheese on Sunday, and if you do, you cannot take it out.

Here is a sad one. Kansas state law forbids one to serve ice cream or cherry pie on the Sabbath. Try this one. In Connecticut, pickles which, when dropped twelve inches, collapse in their own juice are illegal. They must remain whole and even bounce.

[This reminds us of a true story.
