

Cystic fibrosis is one of the most life-threatening diseases of children. A little known entity only twenty-five years ago, it occurs in approximately one of every 1,600 live births in this country.

Funds raised through bike-a-thons are used to assist the parents of afflicted children by lending them therapeutic e-

quipment which they might not otherwise be able to afford, as well as finance a national effort to find a control or cure for cystic fibrosis and all other serious children's lung-damaging diseases.

polio	3 doses
measles 1 dose	or history
German measles	1 dose
