Barbara is engaged to

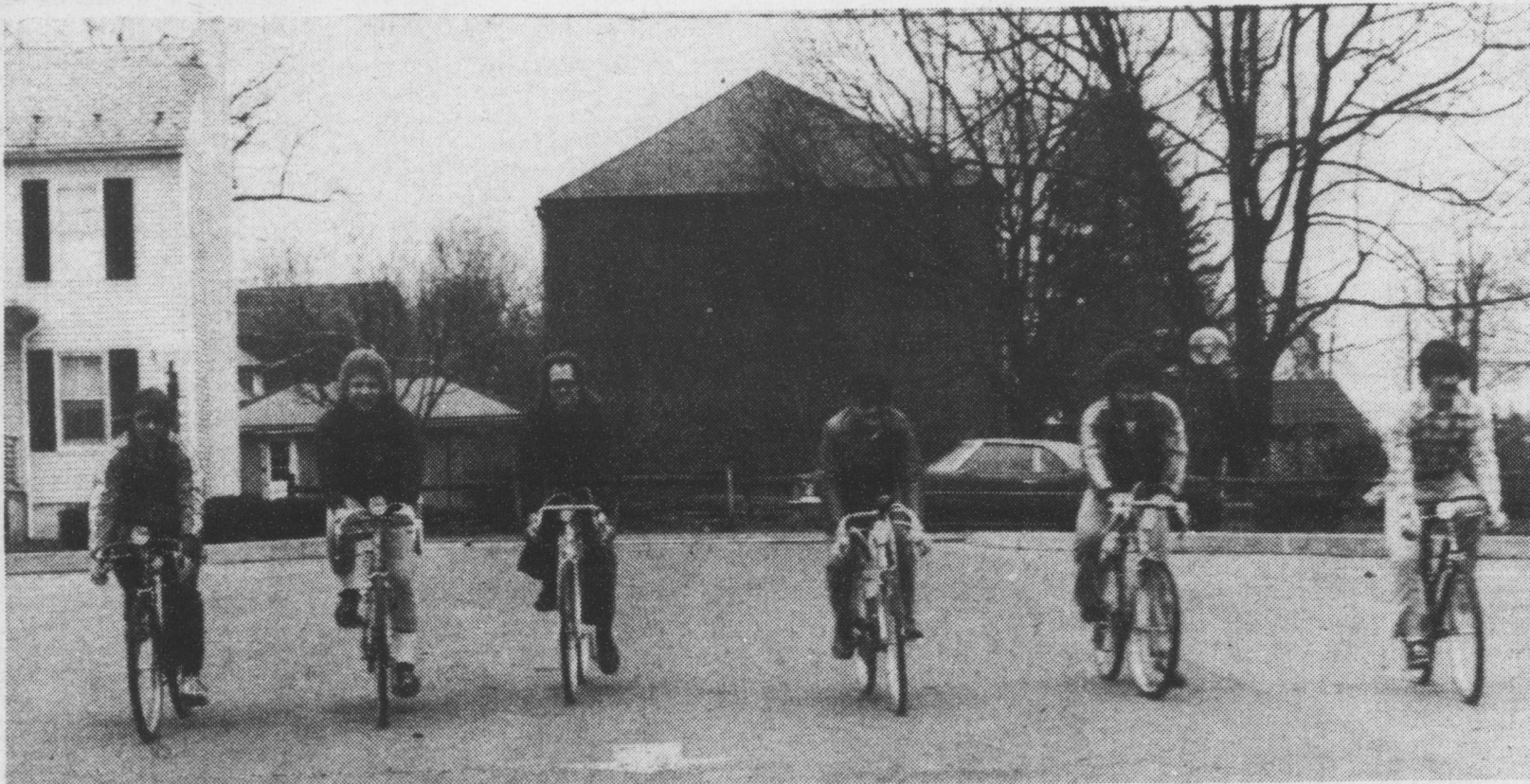

Kindergarten registration

Kindergarten registration for the Donegal School District will be held as follows:

Grandview	April 17
Maytown	April 18
Riverview	April 19
Seiler	April 20

Registration hours will be between the hours of 8:30 AM and 3:30 PM. Parents should register their children at the school nearest their homes. It is not necessary to bring the child to school to register him.

To be eligible for fall 1979 enrollment, your child must have turned five

years old by September 5th of this year.

Birth certificates and immunization records must be brought: no child is legally allowed into school without a record of shots.

The required shots are:

diphtheria	3 doses
tetanus	3 doses
polio	3 doses
measles	1 dose or history
German measles	1 dose

Parents who want to enroll a child in 1st grade, without prior kindergarten experience, should contact Gene Newcomer at the school.
