S. Before you place a long distance call to a business, check to see if they have a toll-free number. You can recognize it because it has an 800 prefix instead of a regular area code. If they have one it's usually displayed in their advertising, or you may find it listed in your own local telephone directory. If so, the call's on them, and you save.

T. If you don't know or can't find an "800" number in the phone book, simply dial your long distance access code, 800 and 555-1212 to reach the "800" directory assistance operator.

U. The information pages at the front of your local phone book are a good source for tips on how to place your calls and how to save time and money in using your telephone. Look in the book, and save.

V. If a coin phone takes your money but doesn't give you your call, you're, of course, entitled to a refund. Use a working phone to dial "O" for "Operator" and tell her what happened. We'll send you a refund in the mail. (We'd also appreciate it if you'd tell the operator the number and location of the phone that's out of order so we can get it fixed as soon as possible.)




