Tests of fish collected from the Susquehanna River around TMI have shown no signs of radiation, according to the Pennsylvania Fish Commission. Area Manager Larry Jackson, aided by technicians Bud Baker and Ron Huey, conducted the tests.

One sample of fish was collected at Falmouth on April 12th. No radioactive iodine was detected in them.
