The Girl of the Month is Mindy Turek, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. David Turek.

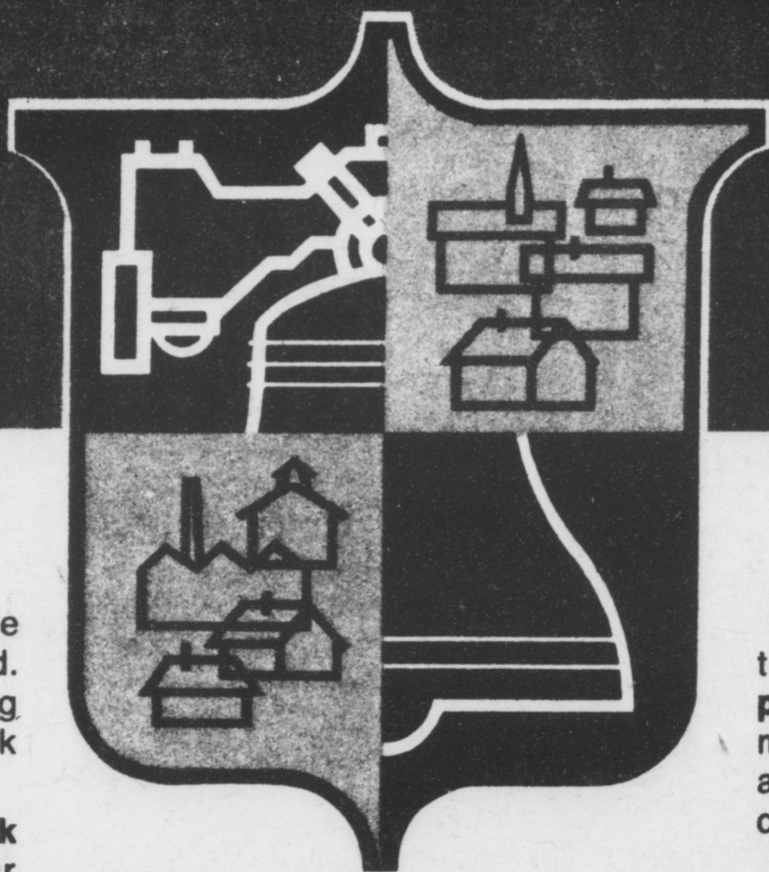

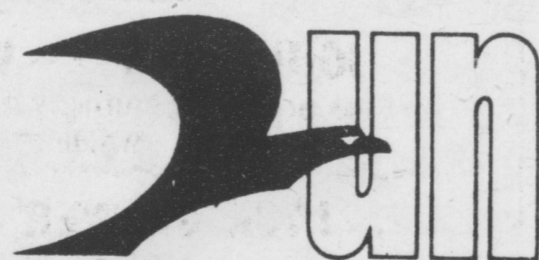
