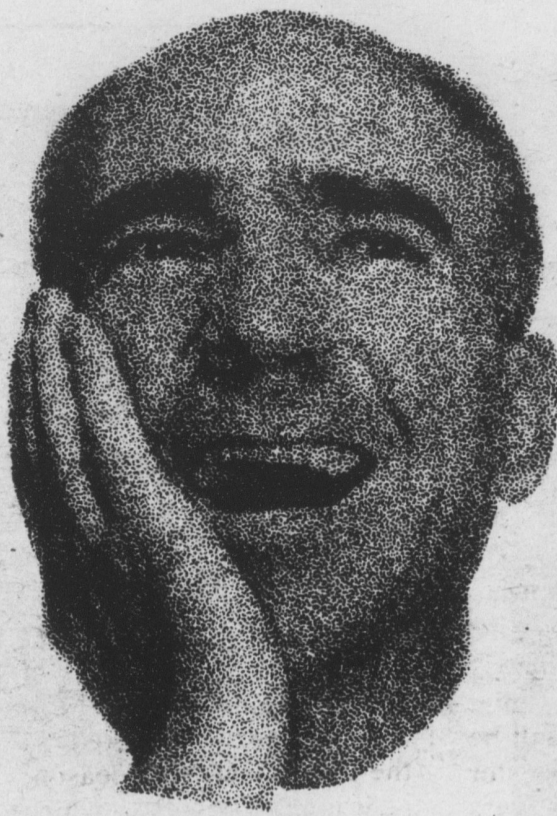
Michael Larry Shultz of Marietta is celebrating his 11th birthday May 18. Happy Birthday, Tank!
