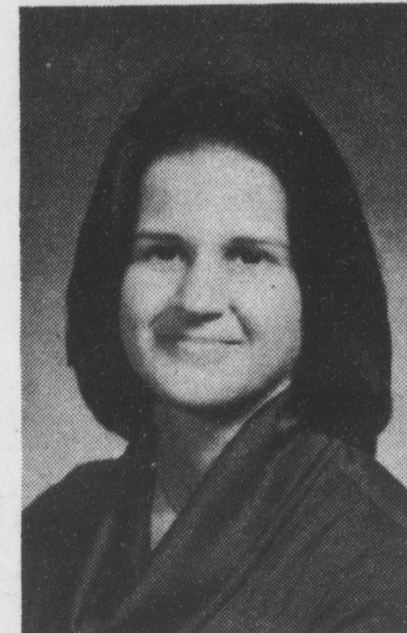

professional studies in Christian Education while Miss Spangler had her professional studies in Missions.

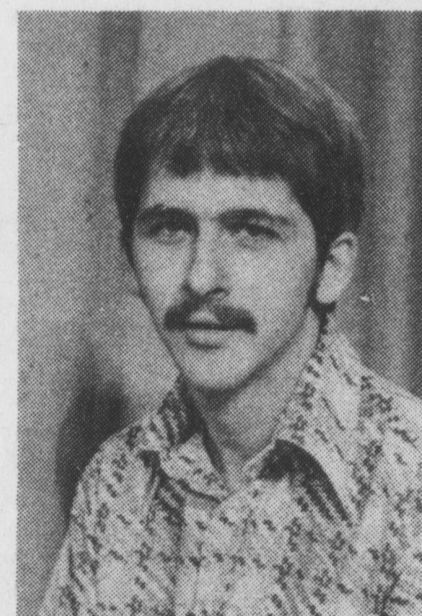

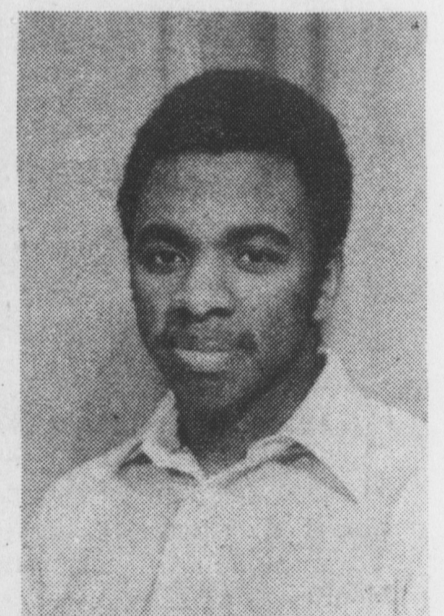
