Message from the booster club

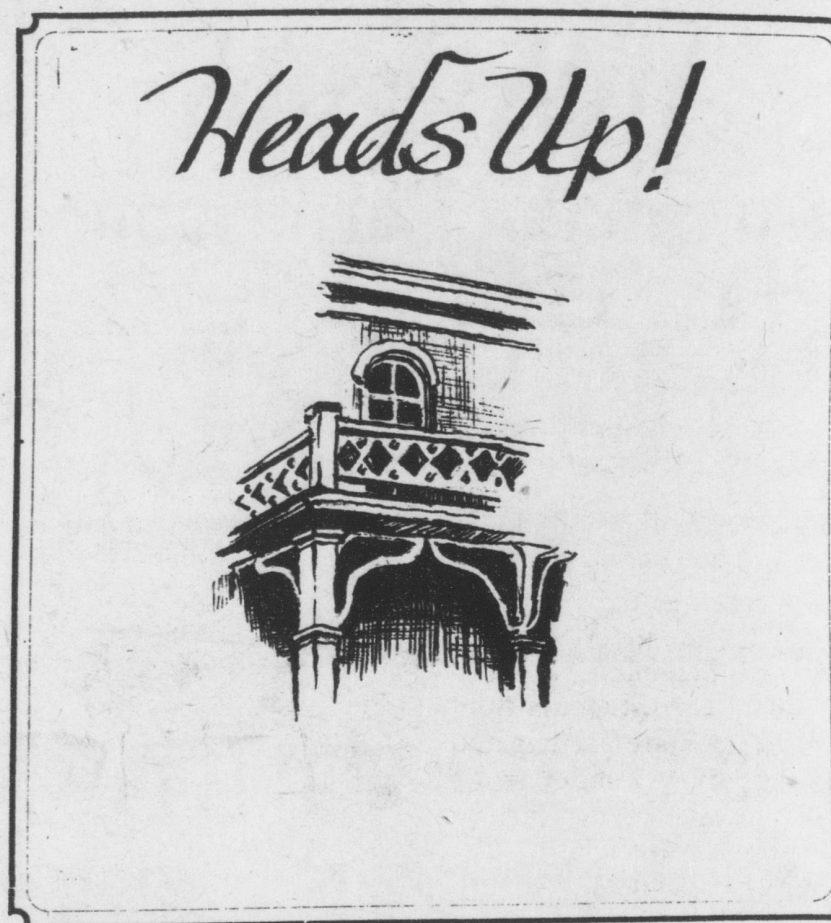
PARENTS—WE NEED YOU.
