Shank's and Houseal's general stores in Maytown were sold out. Mount Joy

Saturday morning the Exxon self-service station in mount Joy was selling gas. Cars were lined up for several blocks, requiring police supervision. One customer had to wait an hour and twenty minutes to get his gas. A line also formed at Phillips 66 across from Union National Mount Joy bank. Both the Exxon and Phillips stations planned to be open Monday. Bob Heisey's Sunoco was open Saturday morning with two lines leading into the station, but Heisey ran out of gas and doesn't expect more till July 1. The Arco station across from Heilig's funeral home was closed Saturday afternoon, but James Wise, proprietor, said he was receiving more regular gas and expected to be open Sunday. Wise explained that the reason there was a very acute shortage of unleaded gas was because a large shipment had been ruled sub-standard and had to go back to the refinery for further treatment. Wise said that Arco had gas, but the government would not permit the stations to exceed their allocations, 15 per cent below 1977 sales. Wise said that he would stay open as much as he could, as a public service, but he was expecting some very rough times.
