The Donegal School Board OKed \$10,000 of roof repairs for the DHS gym at their last meeting. The work will be done by J.M. Young & Sons, Inc.

Work is also needed at Riverview School. A bid for \$2,950 worth of work on the heating and cooling system there was awarded to the Powers Co.

It was announced that next year's Pennsylvania School Subsidy will be \$128,805. The budget was reopened in order to get this money into it.

The board gave the longasked-for computer system purchase the go-ahead. The new DHS computers will cost \$4000 or \$5000.
