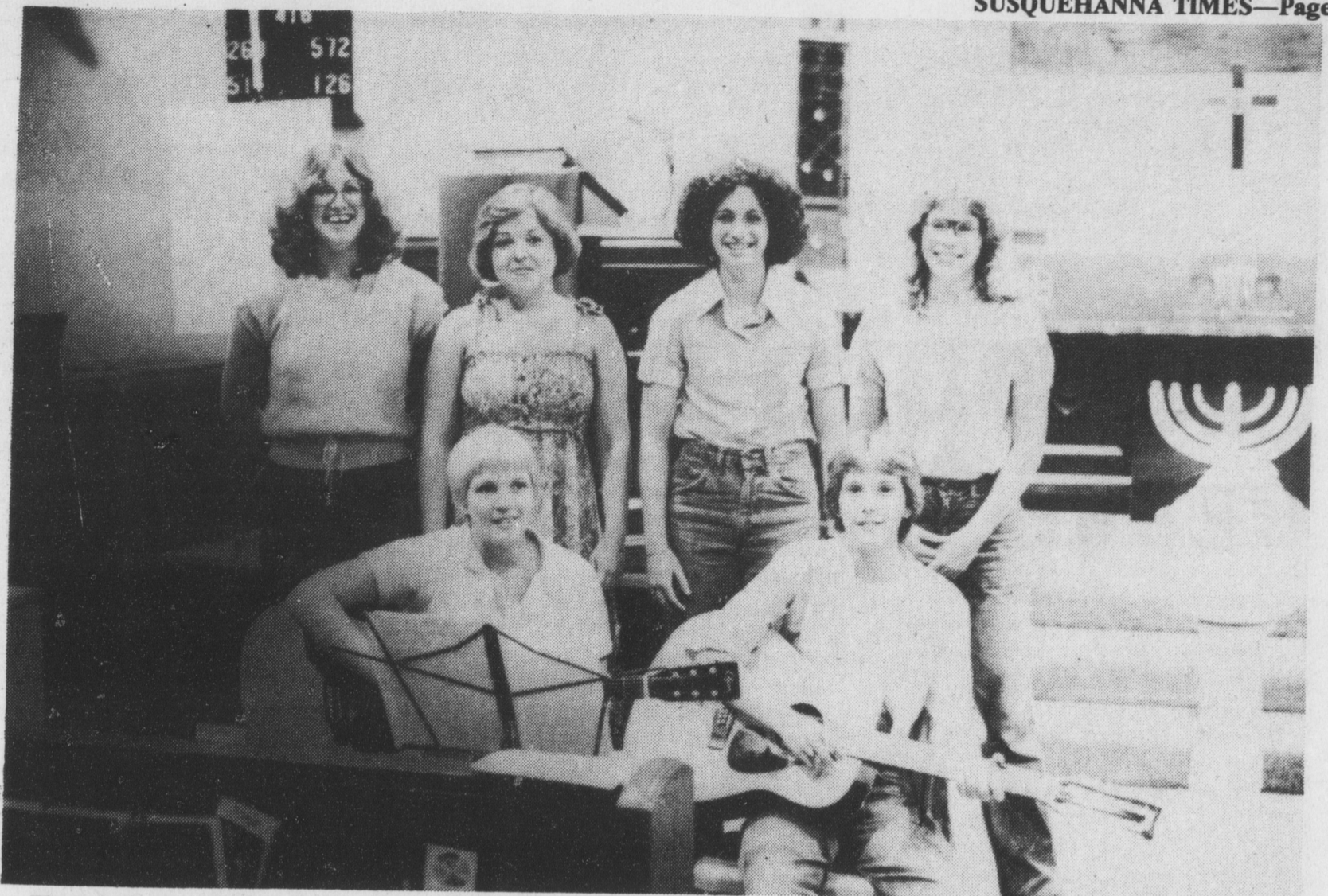




Rev. Thomas Ridenhour, left, and Rev. Robert Lescallete

Youth and adults convene at St. John's Lutheran in Maytown for study, fellowship, food, and singing

On Sunday, July 29th, youth and adults from several area congregations came together at St. John's Lutheran Church in Maytown for an afternoon and evening of study, fellowship, food, and singing.

Sponsored by four local Lutheran congregations, the event took as its theme "The Old Testament and Christians, Today," and

featured the Reverend Dr. Thomas Ridenhour from Gettysburg Seminary as the keynote speaker. Other speakers at elective sessions included the Rev. Russell Burr, St. Luke's, Bainbridge; the Rev. David Klepper, Trinity, Mount Joy; Ronald Good, Church of the Brethren, Elizabethtown; Edith Mumper, Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services, Lititz;

and the Rev. Robert Lescallete, St. John's, Maytown.

Music was provided by an ensemble of guitarists and singers from St. Luke's and St. John's, and Keith Smith, St. John's organist, who accompanied the assembly in the singing of the concluding hymn, "The God of Abraham Praise." Dale Boyer of St. John's directed the food preparation, and

pastors Raymond Fetter and Henri Eberly of Christ Church, Elizabethtown, supervised the pre-congress publicity.

Those who attended the congress returned to their homes and their churches with a heightened awareness of how the Old Testament speaks to them as children of the New Covenant and as people living in this time and place.

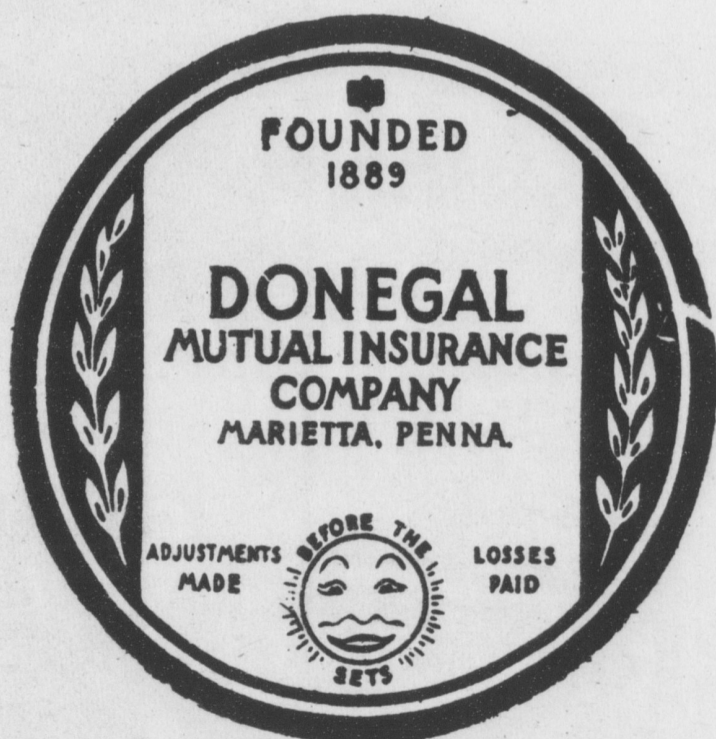
