NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing will be held by the Mount Joy Borough Zoning Hearing Board on Monday, August 20, 1979, at 7:30 P.M., in the Borough Offices Building, 21 East Main Street, Mount Joy, to hear the following petitions:

1. The continuation of a hearing from Friday, July 20, 1979, to consider a request for a special exception by Peifer Brothers, RD#1, Elizabethtown, to establish three (3) apartment units on the third floor of a building located at 8 West Main Street, Mount Joy. The property is located in a General Commercial, C-1, zone in which apartments may be permitted in the same structure as commercial establishments by special exception pursuant to Section 504.d of the Mount Joy Borough Zoning Ordinance of 1975.

2. A request for a variance by Albert A. Pell, d/b/a P.K.B. Associates, P.O. Box 2348, Bethlehem, to construct a sixty-seven (67) stall truck loading terminal, including necessary office space and a truck maintenance building on a tract of land, 21.443 acres, situate at Route 230 East, Mount Joy. The property is located in a Campus Industrial, I-2, zone in which the use of the land as proposed herein is neither permitted nor prohibited. As such, the Zoning Hearing Board is requested to make a decision on whether to permit or deny the use of the land in this manner pursuant to Section 105 of the Mount Joy Borough Zoning Ordinance of 1975.
