1. The continuation of a hearing from Friday, July 20, 1979, to consider a request for a special exception by Peifer Brothers, RD#1, Elizabethtown, to establish three (3) apartment units on the third floor of a building located at 8 West Main Street, Mount Joy. The property is located in a General Commercial, C-1, zone in which apartments may be permitted in the same structure as commercial establishments by special exception pursuant to Section 504.d of the Mount Joy Borough Zoning Ordinance of 1975.

2. A request for a variance by Albert A. Pell, d/b/a P.K.B. Associates, P.O. 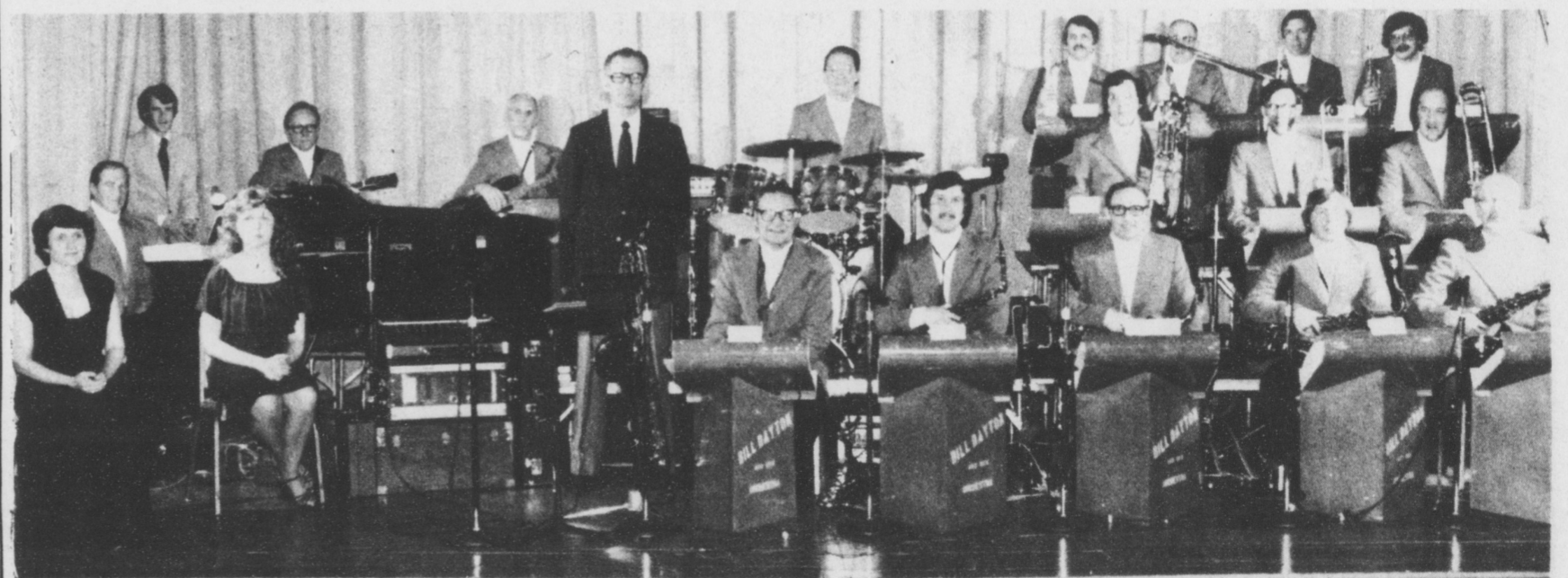
This determination has been made because there is no immediate prospect that new applicants could be issued Certificates to participate in the program in the near future. This suspension will remain in effect until further notice.

Local musicians tour the United States



Bill Dayton Band

Recently, the Bill Dayton band toured the United States. Among those with the 18 member band were H. Morrell Shields of Mount Joy, Ed Brabits from Landisville, Monte Cooper of Columbia, and Phyllis Kreamer of Elizabethtown.

Bill Dayton, band leader, is from Biglerville, Penna. He began organizing his band eight years ago, and has drawn members from Maryland and Penna. His band is known in the area

for playing the sounds of the 30's.

The traveling band, their spouses, and some fans totaling 48 left Gettysburg, Penna. by bus on July 5th, for a nineteen day tour of the Western United States.

Their first stop was Indianapolis, Indiana, which warmly welcomed them. They moved on to Little Amana, Iowa and then Sioux Falls, where they played to an enormous crowd estimated at close to eight hundred people. The group then moved on to Hot

Springs, South Dakota; Cody, Wyoming; Pocatello, Idaho; and Bend, Oregon. On July 12th, they visited Myrtle Point, Oregon—the hometown of Bill Dayton and as the bus entered town the townspeople and Dayton's relatives greeted the Penna. band. The group then went to Redding, California; Reno, Nevada; Salt Lake City, Utah; Laramie, Wyoming; Kearney, Nebraska; Omaha, Nebraska; Des Moines, Iowa; and back to Indianapolis, for the final day before returning to Gettysburg.

Along the way, they played at several establishments, and many times they were asked to play the ole' favorites such as "Take the A Train," "In the Mood," and "Night Train."

When asked if the sight-seeing, band-playing group planned to tour next year, Mr. Shields replied, "they hope so, but with a change of tour to the West Coast." He also added, "They were treated so kindly across the entire country and enjoyed themselves so much!"
