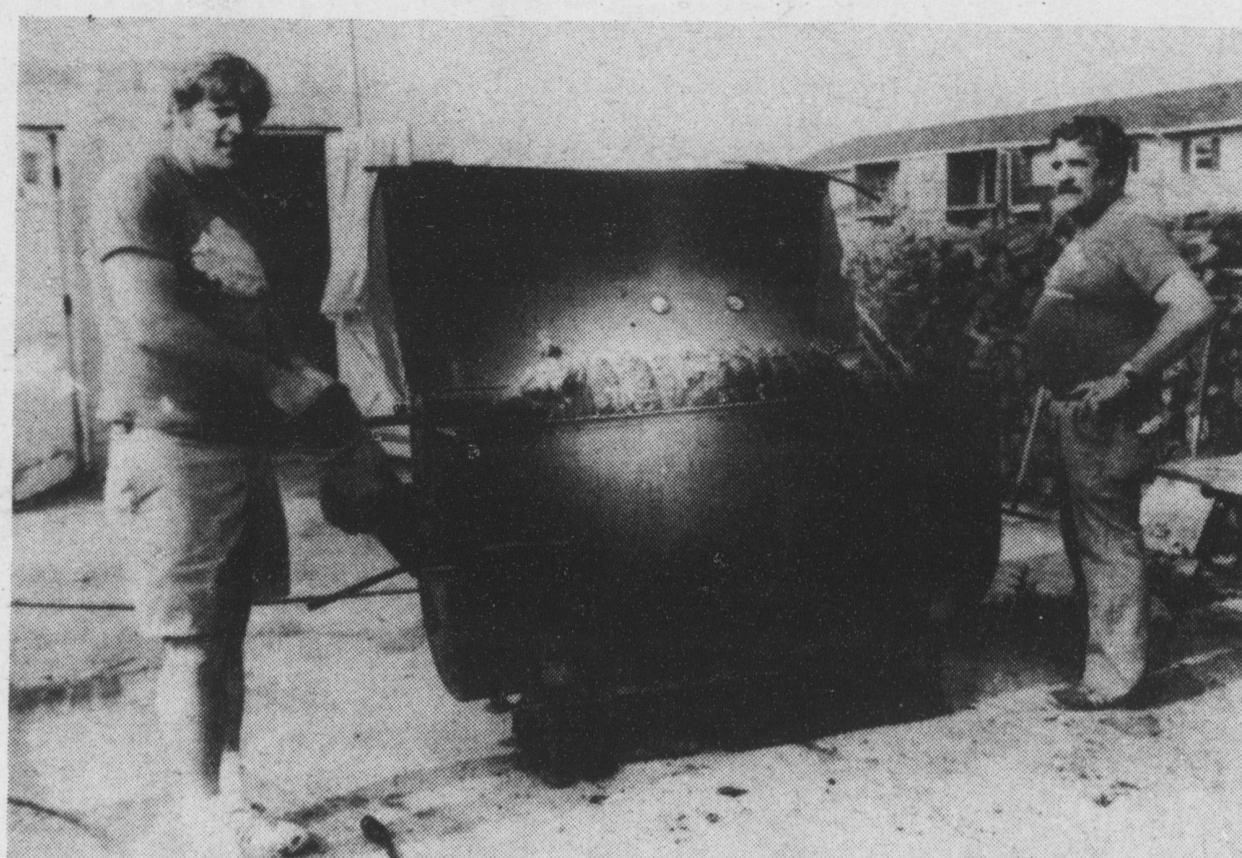


Florin firemen honor six at 2nd annual outing
