

Mount Joy Jaycees sponsor mixed doubles run also individual runs for all ages on Sat., Oct. 20

The Mount Joy Jaycees is sponsoring a mixed double run on Saturday, October 20, 1979. It is a unique event to encourage male-female running teams, with individuals invited to compete also! The event consists of a 5 mile (team) run; 2 mile (team) run; and a 1 mile kiddies' fun run. Registration/check in is at 8AM; kids' run 8:30AM; 2 mile run 9AM; and 5 mile run 10AM.

The starting point and finishing point is Mount Joy Vo-Tech School, along the Sportsman Road, 1/4 mile off Manheim/Mount Joy Road. Exit south from I-283 along Manheim-Mount Joy Rd.

The two and the one mile courses are mostly flat out and back. The five mile course is hilly, challenging to experienced runners.

A pre-entry fee of \$4 is due (postmarked) October 12. Fee after October 12th is \$5 up to race time. Checks should be made payable to "Mount Joy Jaycees." Fees are not refundable. There

will be Tee-shirts awarded to all contestants who register by October 19th. The team awards are as follows: \$25 in gift certificates to the top male-female team (combined times) in each team race; \$15 in gift certificates to each second place team; \$10 in gift certificates to each third

place team. (NOTE: A male-female couple must enter as a team when they register or they will compete as individuals. No changes will be made). **INDIVIDUALS:** Gift certificates will be awarded to the first male and first female for both races in each age bracket: 10-19; 20-29; 30-39; 40-49;

50 and over. Recognition to second and third place finishers. Prizes to top three finishers (either sex) in kiddies' fun run, ages 4-12.

Refreshments will be available at races' end for contestants. There will be cool water available along the route of the 5 mile race only.

All homes must first be approved by the Office of Aging before a placement is made. Since matching the resident and the home

provider is very important, considerable time and selectivity go into a Shared Living placement. Following placement, a Shared Living staff person will visit the home on a regular basis to monitor the placement.

Also, Shared Living may be right for you if you need a home, are 60 years old or older, living alone or with relatives is not suitable, and you do not need nursing home care.
