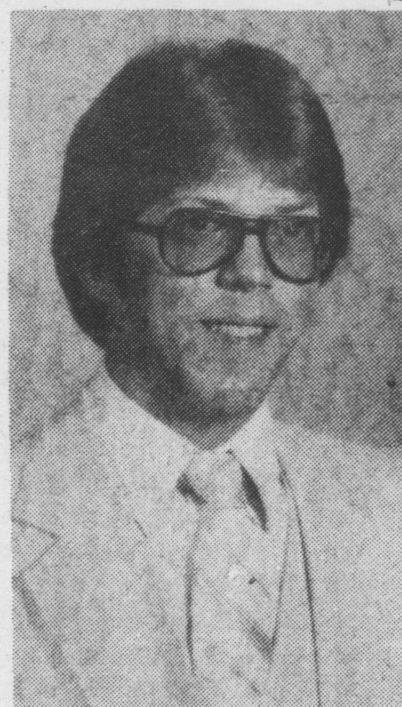
Deb is also Miss Donegal Area.
