Council may suggest building by-pass, new bridge

Bruce Hamer, Mount Joy Borough Manager, informed Council Monday night that the state of Pennsylvania is planning to spend half a million federal dollars improving roads around the state. The state is asking local municipalities for

suggestion on how to spend the half million.

The Mount Joy Council discussed the possibility Monday night of suggesting the the state that build a by-pass from the Marietta Pike around to Lefever Road and connecting with Route

283. Such a by-pass was proposed over ten years ago in the comprehensive plan for the Donegal area.

Council also discussed the possibility of suggesting that the Marietta Avenue bridge over the railroad be repaired.

Problems about Regency Apts.

Mount Joy Borough Council discussed Monday night various drawbacks that the proposed Regency Apartments for the aged on Route 230 east of the borough, might have.

Chief criticism voiced was that the apartments are so far away from the central shopping center of Mount Joy and far from any grocery store. It seemed to various members of Council that

closeby shopping facilities are a necessity for elderly people.

Hamer mentioned, however, that bus service is being planned for the housing development.

Stops signs tried, taken down

Stop signs which had been placed on a trial basis on Market Avenue at

Church Street for 90 days will be removed. The decision to take the signs

down was made by Mount Joy Borough Council Monday night.

The signs had been put at the request of local residents, to prevent speeding across the intersection.

The signs were also taken down at the request of residents, who found them a nuisance.

Council voted to amend a ordinance forbidding barns housing cattle and horses closer than 50 feet to a house or street in the borough.

The proposed amendment will forbid barns closer than 100 feet to dwellings or streets.

Olweiler Realty will be told that a sign they put up at their office on West Main Street is in violation of a local ordinance for protruding too far from the building. Olweiler will be able to appeal for permission to retain their sign from the borough zoning hearing board.

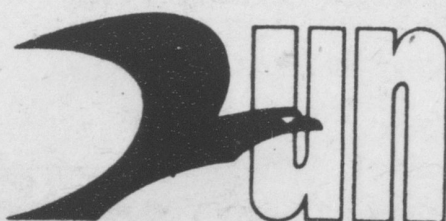
