The Jaunt consists of a five-mile run and a two-mile "Fun Run," both to be held on Oct. 28th at 2:00pm.

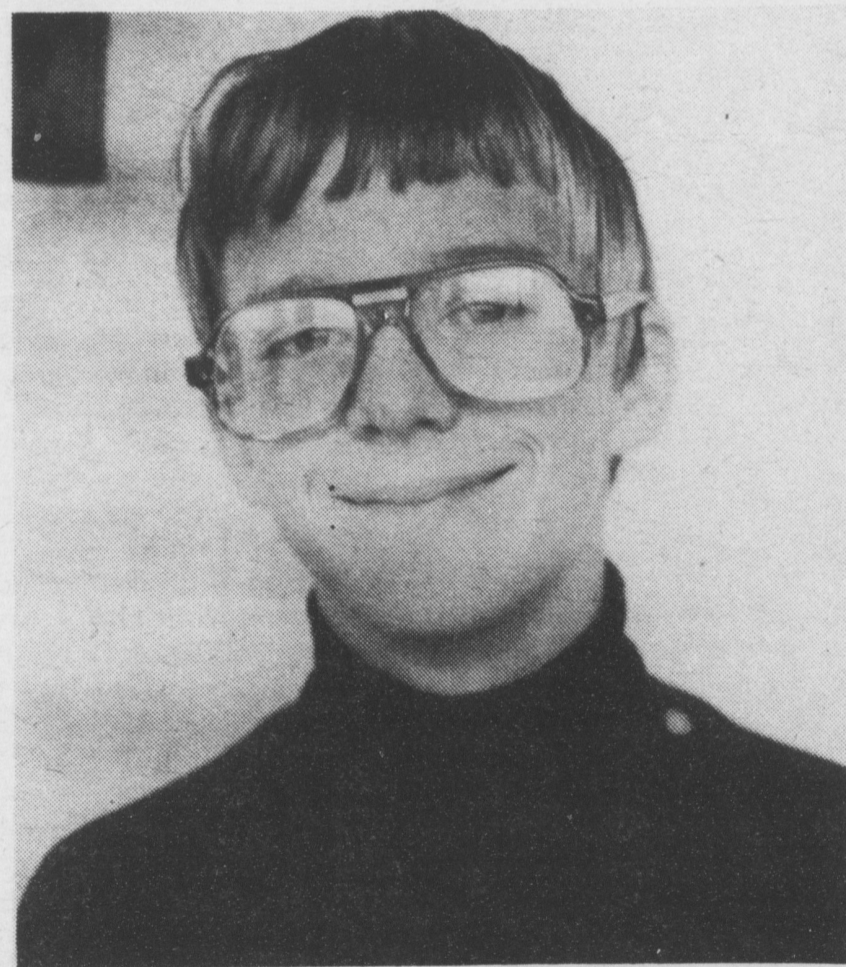
