PP&L's new Berwick nuclear plant has two control rooms. One will operate the plant; the other is a dummy, for training operators.

Fake controls, or "simulators," have been used for years to train airplane pilots. Now PP&L is applying that idea to nuclear plants.

The fake control room, which cost \$10 million, is just like the real control room, dial for dial, except that it's hooked to a big computer instead of a power plant. Operators in training will have to deal with any of the computer's 1500 mal-




