School board discusses roofing, hears Price propose town meeting

that they "wait until it is dry and finish the job."

Members of the extra curricular committee will check out the situation. Until matters are completed, the Zemco Corporation will be paid \$7,800 which is 60% of the \$13,000 contract price for track renovations. This is considered a "safe amount" to pay.

In additional maintenance business, it was decided to go ahead with corrected the roof drainage problem at the junior high school.

Other matters considered less important will be lumped together in order to receive a package price. These will be budgeted for next year, and they include roof repair at the junior high and at the Grandview building.

Concerning the high school roofing problems, it was explained that the Heidler Roofing Company is making a \$2,970 settlement for ceiling damages. The district still owes \$3,000 to the company which was withheld because of the damage.

In additional business, the board received a letter of intention to retire from Hubert K. Peters, assistant to the principal, Math Department coordinator and teacher in the junior high school. Mr. Peters is completing his 33rd year of service with the district. He was a teacher and a coach at Marietta High School prior to the formation of the first Donegal jointure. He was also the first Donegal High School football coach.

Mrs. Judith K. Overlander, a fourth grade teacher at Riverview, requested mater-

nity leave, to be effective from January 2, 1980 to March 31, 1980.

Walter Price suggested the idea of a town meeting to the board. This would be a meeting for board members, administrators, faculty and parents to meet and share their concerns. Price felt this would create greater communication between the various factions of the school district.

Zelda Heisey supported this proposal, saying that in an informal survey she found that 95% of those asked did not know our school board members.

In regard to the bus schedules, two women expressed concern over a consistently late bus. Their children were not getting to Riverview for the beginning of classes. The matter will be looked into.
