[continued from front page] that a different election result would have occurred had the voting machine been working properly, since he was presenting a strong write-in challenge to the incumbent, William Breckline.

Flanagan's petition asks that the court declare the election for Constable be set aside and a new election be ordered, and that the voting machine in the First Ward of Marietta be replaced by a properly-functioning voting machine.

Last week Jayne Howell, Claire Lavin and Robert Klindedinst, all electors of the First Ward had asked the Lancaster County Court to order a recount of their

ward's votes for Constable, stating that defective voting machines made write-in votes impossible.

William Breckline, in-

cumbent Constable, and the only candidate on the ballot, got 250 votes. Flanagan, running as a write-in candidate for Constable, had 153 write-in votes.
