
Upcoming events for the

Food stamps will be easier to get for elderly & disabled after Jan. 1

New federal food stamp rules will go into effect on January 1st, making it easier for elderly or disabled people to get food stamps.

The new rules increase the amount that these households can deduct for medical and shelter costs. Under the present rules, shelter costs are fixed at \$90 per month, and there is no deduction for medicine.

Starting next year anyone 60 or older, who is getting Supplemental Security Income or disability payments from Social Security may claim higher deductions.

The new medical deduction will be equal to your medical costs over \$35 per month. The new shelter deduction will be the amount by which your rent exceeds half of your adjusted income (adjusted income is income after all other deductions).

Allowable shelter costs include rent, mortgage payments, utility bills, property taxes, and insurance.
