



Mark Rineer places his call to the White House

Riverview students phone Jimmy; urge peaceful solution in Teheran

Riverview Elementary Students placed phone calls to the White House last Wednesday, and talked to President Carter's "Comment Office Staff."

The project began when reading teachers Carol Lambert and Elizabeth Smedley discovered a notice in the newspaper stating that a call could be made to Washington which would be recorded on tape and submitted to the president. However, when Mrs. Lambert made a "trial call," she discovered a committee, not Mr. Carter, on the other end of the line.

Students in 3d through 6th grade classes chose topics and placed calls to the White House committee. Eight calls, costing \$1.18 each, were made on the school phone. A loud

speaker allowed other class members to listen.

Students said that they hoped Mr. Carter would find a peaceful solution to the Iranian crisis, because they do not want their fathers and brothers to go to war. One student suggested that ordinary Americans travel to Iran by airplane, car and train to bring the hostages home.

Another pupil wondered if Carter feared radiation when he visited the crippled Three Mile Island reactor, and asked, "When we grow up will we get cancer?" Another suggested that TMI be shut down rather than be allowed to discharge radioactive waste into the Susquehanna.

Other suggestions were: fight pollution, lower the price of gasoline, prevent

school property from being destroyed, get more food in the cafeteria, lower taxes, train welfare recipients to make them independent.
