The public health nurses also invite all community persons interested in having their blood pressure checked to come between 11:00 and 12:00 noon on the same days (Tuesday and Thursday).

We regret to inform the public that the Well Child Clinic will be having its final sessions in March. Children will be referred to other health facilities for routine care after the March 11 and 13 conferences. Similar services are offered in Elizabethtown and Columbia.
