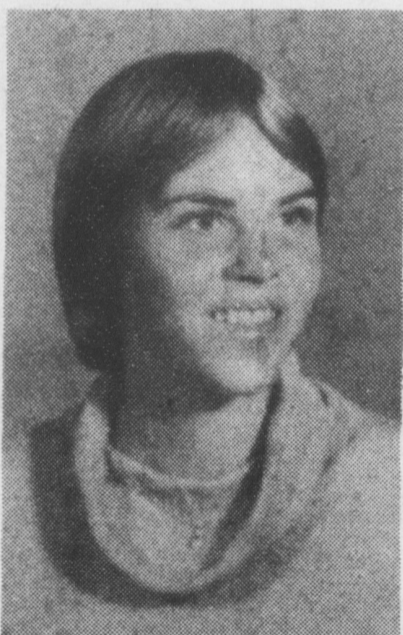
With these two victories their overall won-lost record
