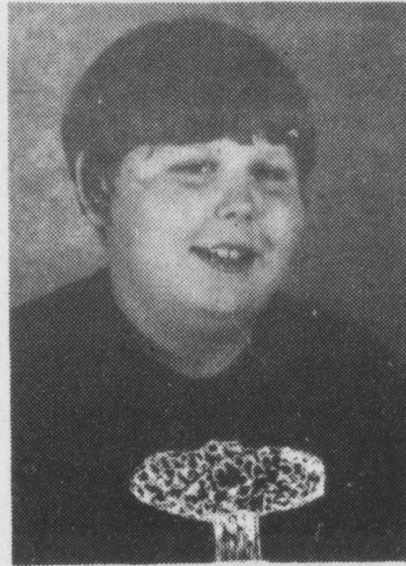
Donald Rossman of Mount Joy, age 9, won first place in the central Pennsylvania division of an art show for the mentally handicapped held in Harrisburg last week.
