IW Beahm junior high students see film on spinal cord injuries

Students at Beahm Junior High School heard about the Spinal Cord Injury Program of the Milton Hershey Medical Center and the Elizabethtown Hospital on Thursday, March 27. A film and slides showed victims of spinal cord injuries, how the injuries occurred and the consequences of paralysis.

A question/answer session followed. Students learned that spinal cord injuries are not hereditary. They are usually the result of carelessness in performing such physical activities

as swimming, hang gliding, skiing, surfing, boating and speeding in cars or on motorcycles.

Although paralysis from an injury is permanent, treatment and rehabilitation aim to preserve as much bodily function as possible for the injured person.

Psychological adjustment is an important part of

helping the patient and the family cope with living with the handicap and learning to become integrated in the community activities once again.

The program was presented by Miss Eileen Keegan, a rehabilitation coordinator at the Elizabethtown Hospital, and it was well received by the students.
