Mount Joy Joyceettes offer babysitting clinic

The Mount Joy Joyceettes are sponsoring a babysitting clinic for Donegal School District students. Boys and girls in grades 7 and 8 are eligible.

The course consists of four two-hour classes beginning April 28 and continuing through May 5, 12 and 19, from 6:30 to 8:30 pm at Trinity Lutheran Church of Mount Joy. Registration will be at Beahm Junior High from April 15 to 17. A \$1.00 donation will be collected the first evening.

The course provides an informative and valuable background for current and prospective babysitters. A

registered nurse will give instruction on basic first aid and care of infants. A fireman and policeman will speak on fire safety and emergency procedures. Students will have the opportunity to discuss expectations of babysitters with a panel of mothers and children of various ages.
