The storyhour offered by the Mount Joy Library (for all pre-school children in Mount Joy between the ages of three and five) will resume sometime during the month of September 1980.

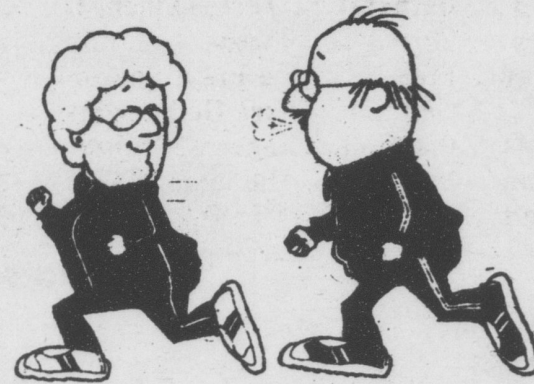
Canadian HS Band performs at Beahm

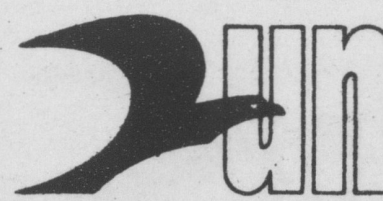
