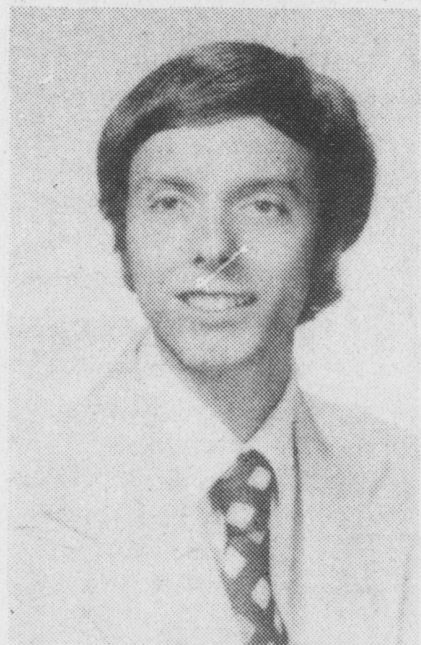
He has been active in the S.U. Symphonic Band and Chapel Choir, is president of the Chapel Council, and has
