district solicitor.

The board approved both
the Lancaster County Vo-
Tech budget and the
Lancaster Vo-Tech divers-
ified occupations budget.
Board member Dr. Jeffer-
son Hartzler recommended
that the criteria be tightened
up for student admittance so
that students do not waste
time in a dead-end job.

Mrs. Betty Hershey of
