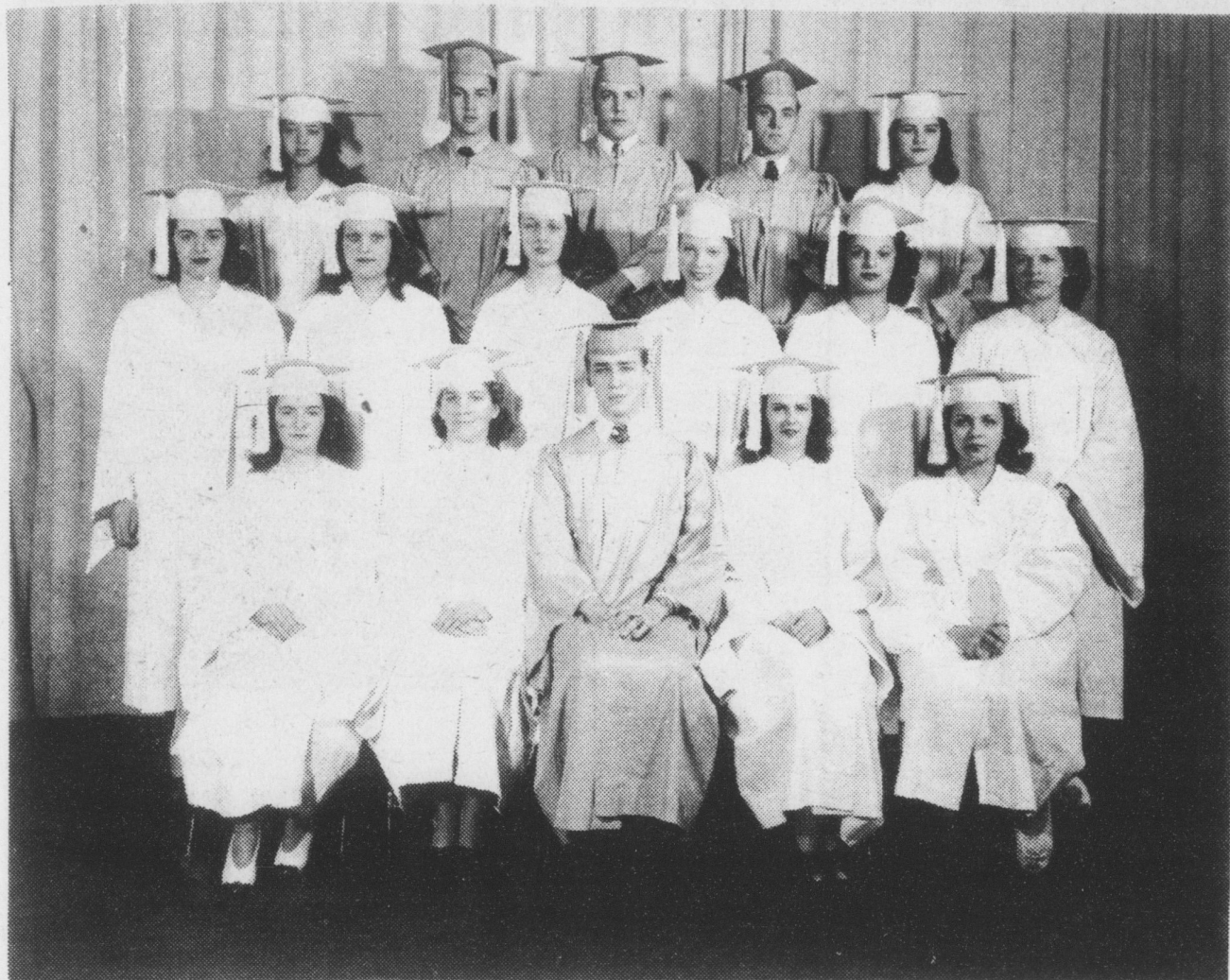


Marietta High School Alumni banquet held Saturday

Letters were read from former teachers Harvey Shue and R.F. Dubbs.

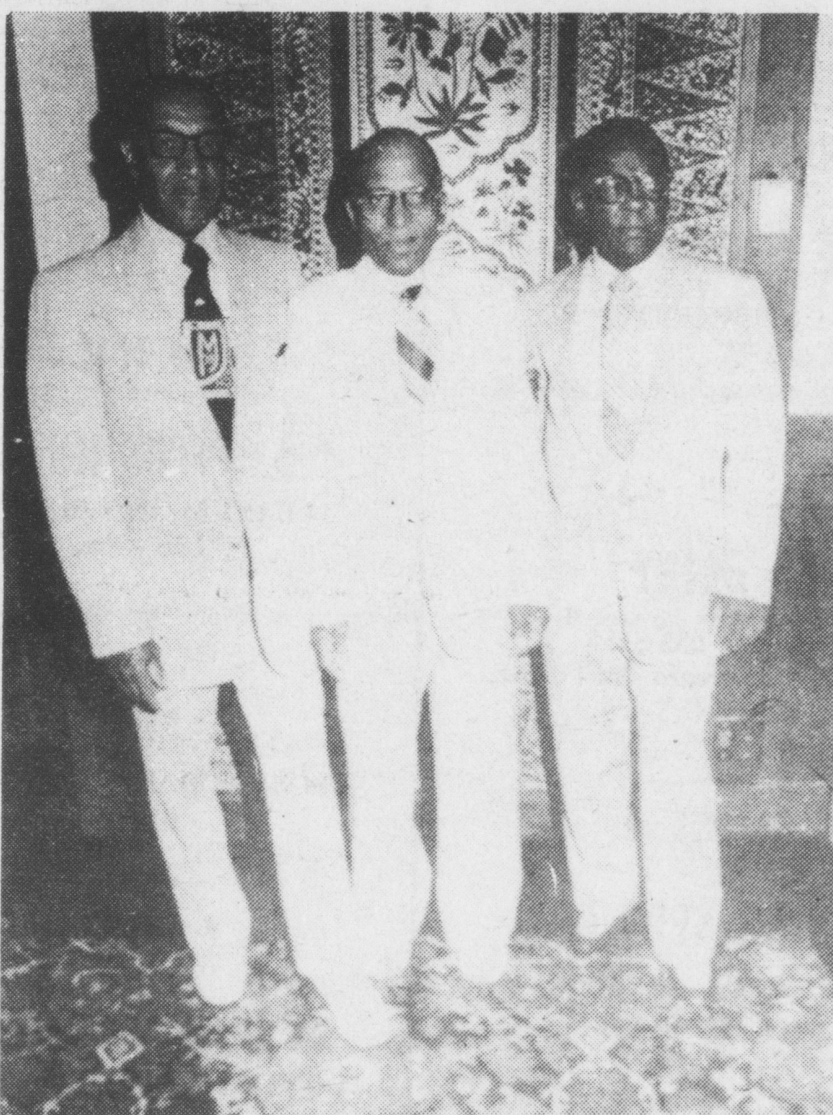
Prizes were won for the following requirements: The member of the class of 1930 who won the State Sensations Competitive Examinations for Lancaster County, Lewis Schock; To the
