Dr. Ford is a native of Columbia and joined the LVC faculty in 1965. He now resides in Annville.

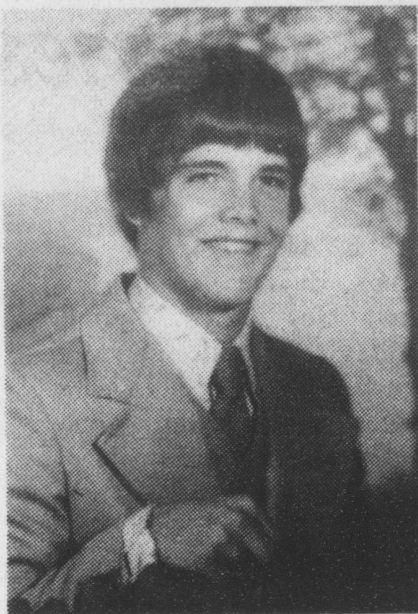

Sandra L. McQuate, R1, Box 109, Mount Joy, has been named to the Dean's List for Spring semester at York College of Pennsylvania.

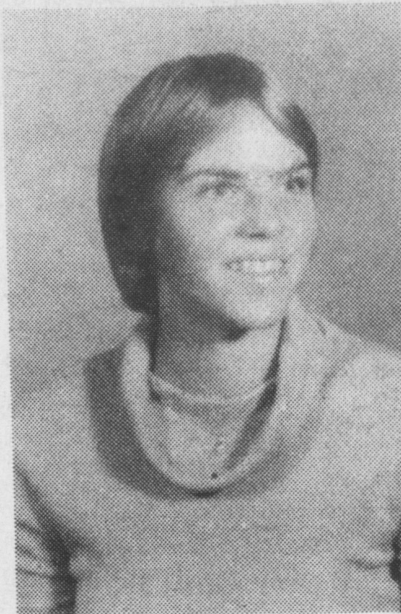

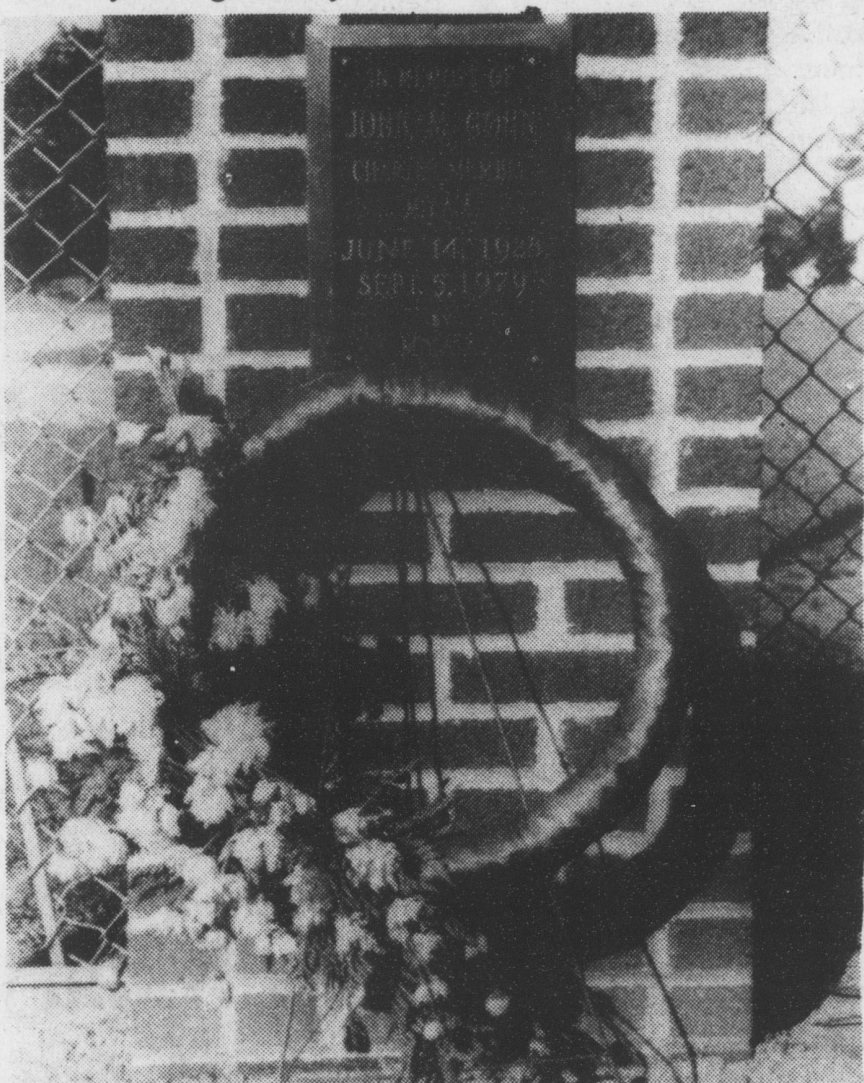
Meszaros & Merchant honored by coaches
