

Board approves 1980-81 budget

The Donegal School Board, at last Thursday's meeting, moved to accept the preliminary budget of \$5,117,865. The new budget will keep the 106 mill rate on real estate. For additional information on the 1980-81 budget see the May 21, 1980 edition of the Susquehanna Times.

In other action, the board voted to appoint Mrs. Mildred N. Smith, Marietta, to serve as school tax collector for Marietta Borough as of July 1, 1980. She will replace Mr. Jeff S. Bryant who resigned. Mrs. Smith is currently residing in Columbia, but is planning to return to her Marietta

home at 444 East Market Street.

The Sico Company of Mount Joy was awarded the bid for fuel oil supplied for the 1980-81 year.

The office of corresponding secretary is a new position created to reduce the work load of the recording secretary in the organization. Elected as director for two years was Ken Ross. Elected to three-year director terms were Dr. J. H. Brown and Mr. Robert Cresswell.



and the surface material is peeling off. Estimate to remove the present surface is \$4,800, to apply new surface is \$3,920 and materials cost \$6,000 for a \$14,720 total to repair the problem. The building and maintenance committee will look into the feasibility of putting a new surface over the old one.

It was noted that the district surplus sale will be held this evening, June 25, at the high school DIG gym which is now stored full of items sent from all district buildings. Items for sale include several pianos and the old junior high school boiler stored at Maytown. It was mentioned that all the storage sheds made at the junior high have been sold.

The Board voted to allow the construction of another water tower at the Maytown School.

There was some discussion concerning plans for LD (learning disability) and EMR (special education) students at the high school and junior high levels. The present plans are to use the same room and teacher for each group. Alternative solutions will be sought from other districts.

MJ Friendship Fire Co. moves into new station

Mount Joy Friendship Fire Company No. One, Inc. moved into its newly built station at 111 New Haven Street last Saturday, and one minute after all the equipment was installed Friendship received its first ambulance call. Seven hours later the first fire call was answered from the new station.

Volunteer members of the fire company created a small parade through Mount Joy streets as they ceremonially carried the fire bell from the old station to the new one. The bell, donated by Henry Shaffner in 1875, originally hung in the old East Ward School. The bell was moved to Friendship's Market [continued on page 5]
