He and his wife are members of Chiques United Methodist Church where Joe serves as a Sunday School teacher. He and his

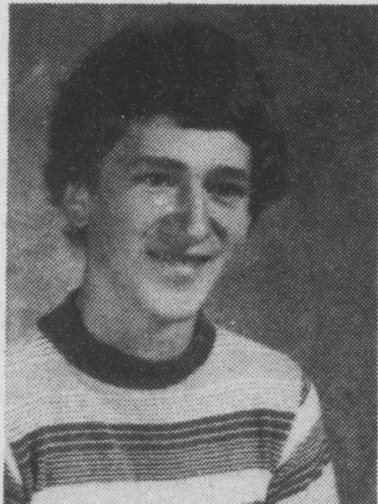

## DHS student Phil Landis attends School for Arts

Phil Landis has received notice from the Lancaster-Lebanon Intermediate Unit 13 that he has been selected to attend the eighth annual Governor's School for the Arts to be held at Bucknell University starting July 6.

He is among 325 artistically talented students selected from 3200 high school sophomore and junior applicants to receive full scholarships to participate in the residential summer arts program. Selection was based on results of highly competitive local and state-wide screenings. Phil was selected for Photographic Arts. Other art areas are creative writing, dance, art, music and animation.

While at the school, the students will receive five weeks intensive training in the art area of their choice as well as related arts experiences. The program places major emphasis on developing young leaders

who will be eager to share their talents and help promote the arts when they return to their home schools and communities.

## July 4th "Stay at Home" weekend in Marietta Thursday, Friday, Sat.

The dates for the Marietta Jaycees' "Stay at Home" fourth of July events were incorrectly listed in last week's issue of the *Susquehanna Times*. The first annual "Run for Independence" will be held this Saturday, July 5, at 10 am. The starting spot is the Marietta War Memorial Park.

The run will include both two and five mile runs through the historic streets of Marietta.

Day-of-the-run registration will be held from 8:30 to 9:30 am at the park and awards will be presented following the five mile run.

Awards will be given to the over-all winner and to first place finishers in each

of the following age groups in both races for both men and women:

Youth to 18 years; 19-29 years; 30 to 39 years; 40 to 49 years; and 50 and over.

The "Stay at Home" event also includes one of the largest fireworks displays in Central Pennsylvania to be held at Memorial Park Saturday night.

Following the performance by Hunter the fireworks will go off. This year's show includes a new section of oriental shells.

Proceeds from the three day event will go toward the Marietta Jaycees' school renovation project.
