The bride-elect graduated from Hempfield High School and Millersville State College. She is employed by the

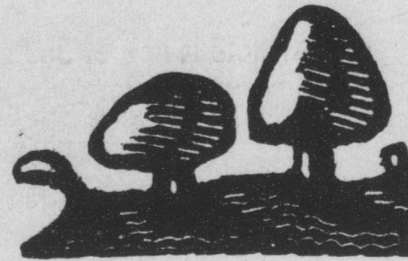
Donegal School District, Mount Joy.
