GARY T. COLEMAN

Gary Thomas Coleman, 20, of Mount Joy RD2, died of injuries sustained in a one-car accident early Sunday morning in Mount Joy.

Coleman was a passenger in a car driven by Debra E. Mumma, 21, Mount Joy RD1.

The car was westbound on West Main Street, Mount Joy, when it went off the side of the road in front of 977 West Main Street.

The car, traveling the shoulder of the road for almost 130 feet, hit a telephone pole and guard posts before Miss Mumma regained control of the vehicle.

Coleman was admitted to St. Joseph Hospital in critical condition with severe head injuries and died early Sunday afternoon.

Miss Mumma was uninjured.
