Maytown Fire Company Receives new "fold-a-tank"

The Maytown-East Donegal Fire Company last Tuesday received a 2500 gallon fold-a-tank to aid in rural area fire fighting. The holding tank is made of acralon, a material stronger than nylon, and will be mounted on the existing

tank truck to be used in areas where hydrants are not available or there is a shortage of water.

The new piece of equipment, the only one of its kind in the part of the county, will be shared with neighboring companies, ac-

ording to Maytown fire chief Charles Shaffner.

The tank was purchased from the Richard Bordner Co., Carlisle, and according to Richard Bordner, the tank is the "largest one in several counties."
