Cub Pack 136

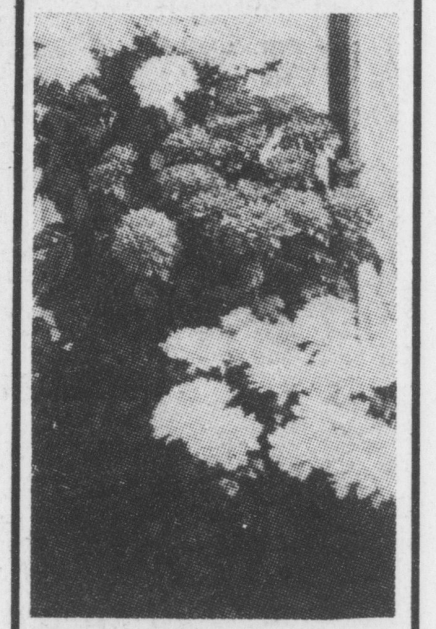
Mount Joy's Cub Pack #136 recently took a 12 mile hike at Mt. Gretna under the leadership of Robert Mark.
