Silver tea set is worth \$350

Q. Does my modern looking three piece silverplated tea set and tray from the Wilcox firm rate as a fortunate find? I believe it dates from the 1920s.—Doris, Paducah, Ky.

A. Unlike their European counterparts, only a few American silversmiths produced any quantity of Art Deco silver. Therefore, existing examples excite collectors. The Wilcox Silver Plate Co., of Meriden, Conn., squared, angled and modernized some of their pieces during the 1920s and 1930s to blend with Art Deco accessories. Most pieces had plain surfaces, devoid of applied ornamentation. Some dinette sets had pieces that fitted into each other on oblong trays. Many tea sets boasted triangular facets. With antiquers, Art Deco silver is simply sensational! Value guide: Wilcox, silverplated three piece tea set, with tray, \$350.


Q. Can you date my "Huntley & Palmers Biscuits Inkstand?" Within the tin stand is a small china inkwell.—Tom, Reading, Pa.

A. Mention the term biscuit tin to an advertising devotee, and presto, the name Huntley & Palmers pops to mind. They pioneered the use of printed tins during the 19th century. For the 1928 Christmas season they issued the cylindrical tin inkstand. The lid features an oval scene of a

fox hunt, flanked by foxtails and hunting horns. Inside the container was a delicious selection of their "Full Cry Biscuits", along with a free gift; a small white china inkwell! Flea market shoppers consider this biscuit tin to be a tasty acquisition, despite its \$85 price tag!

Here is an updated price list for collectors who enjoy scouting around for Boy Scout memorabilia: binoculars, brass, Paris, \$27; book, "Boy Scouts to the Rescue", Maitland, \$22; diary, pocket type, 1922, \$15; calendar, Rockwell, 1944, \$16; hat, campaign type, felt, \$30; knife, Imperial, \$20; pin, fifth round-up, \$7; pin, war service, 1919, \$17; scrapbook, 40 pages, 1930s, \$28.

Q. Can you enlighten me about a Flow Blue cream pitcher in the Cashmere pattern? It was made by Morley.— Evelyn, Columbus, Ind.

A. Flow Blue fanciers admire and acquire the heavily blurred pieces of the mid-19th century. Francis Morley of Shelton, England, potted the coveted Cashmere design during the 1850s. The oriental design printed in cobalt blue on a white ironstone base most be held to a light before the flowing design of trees, flowers, shrubery and animal subjects becomes discernable. The firm's trademark is printed in a dark cobalt on the underside of the pieces. A collector would be tickled pink to find your Flow Blue pitcher priced under \$125.
